Vegetables

All Vegetables and Fruit should be presented on a plain paper plate, unless otherwise stated.

1. 2 courgettes
2. Heaviest marrow or other squash
3. 6 pods of peas, mange-touts, or sugar snap peas
4. 8 pods of french beans
5. 8 pods of runner beans
6. 8 pods of broad beans
7. 2 leeks
8. 4 onions, grown from seed
9. 4 onions, grown from sets
10. Heaviest onion
11. 8 shallots (red or yellow variety)
12. 3 carrots (long variety)
13. 3 carrots (stump variety)
14. 2 parsnips
15. 1 swede
16. 3 turnips (not swedes)
17. 3 globe beetroot
18. Collection of root vegetables, 2 each of 3 or more varieties

19. Basket of vegetables suitable for soup (basket not to exceed 12” / 30cm diameter)
20. 1 cabbage
21. 1 cauliflower
22. 5 round potatoes, all of one variety
23. 5 kidney-shaped potatoes, all of one variety
24. Collection of potatoes, 5 each of 3 different named varieties
25. Heaviest potato
26. Ugliest vegetable
27. Any other vegetable not listed above
28. Any pot-grown herb (pot diameter not to exceed 8”)

Fruit

29. 3 apples
30. 3 plums
31. 6 strawberries
32. Plate of any other edible berries
33. 5 tomatoes (red, all of one variety)
34. 5 tomatoes (yellow, all of one variety)

35. 1 truss of tomatoes
36. 1 cucumber
37. 1 sweet pepper
38. 1 aubergine
39. 3 of any other kind of fruit

Chillies

40. 3 “classic” chilli peppers (red, cone-shaped), all of one variety
41. 3 “fancy” chilli peppers (unusual shape or colour), all of one variety
42. Collection of chilli peppers, 2 each of 3 or more varieties
43. The hottest chilli pepper cultivated in Braehead Community Garden (must state the variety and number of Scoville heat units)
44. A chilli pepper plant in a pot not exceeding 8” / 20cm diameter

Flowers

45. 5 stems of dahlias
46. 3 stems of dahlias
47. 5 stems of chrysanthemums
48. 3 stems of chrysanthemums
49. 3 stems of gladioli
50. 1 single stem of gladioli
51. 5 stems of phlox
52. 3 stems of floribunda/cluster roses
53. 1 single rose, grown for scent
54. 5 stems of sweet peas
55. 3 stems of hydrangeas
56. 6 pansies, displayed on a board

Homemade

Note – all food / drink items will be tasted by the judges!

All items of baking must be presented under clingfilm or in clear plastic bags, on a plain plate.

65. 1 jar of jam

66. 1 jar of pickled vegetables, any variety

67. 1 jar of chutney

68. 1 jar of marmalade

69. 1 jar of honey

70. 1 bottle of home-brewed beer (any type)

71. 1 bottle of home-brewed wine (any type)

72. 1 victoria sponge (jam only, no cream or buttercream)

73. 1 fruit loaf

74. 1 cake made using any vegetable (e.g. carrot cake, beetroot chocolate cake)

75. 1 loaf of bread

76. 1 flask of vegetable soup

77. 4 squares of tablet
78. 3 scones (any variety)
79. A coaster or placemat, made using any craft
80. Item of home-made jewellery
81. A cushion made using any craft, not to exceed 40cm / 16" in any direction
82. Machine-sewn item of clothing
83. Woodwork item
84. Item made from beeswax
85. Arrangement of flowers for a dinner table (arrangement only to be judged – flowers need not have been grown by you)

Photography

Photographs may not exceed 5"x7" and should not be mounted or framed. Please note your photograph will be pinned or pegged up for display.

Children's Section

Age 6 and under

92. A vegetable animal
93. A drawing of a creepy-crawlie on A4 paper

Age 7 to 10

96. A miniature woodland scene in a seed tray
97. 4 squares of traybake
98. A lego model (not to exceed 30cm in any direction)
99. A trophy made using paper mache

Age 11 to 15

100. A box made using any craft (not more than 30cm in any direction)
101. 4 bread rolls
102. Arrangement of wild flowers and grasses in a container of your choice (not to be more than 45cm in any direction)
103. A portrait of a pet (any medium, including photography). No bigger than A4 size.

Judging and Prizes

There are **103 classes**, spread across **7 sections** (Vegetables, Fruit, Chillies, Flowers, Homemade, Photography, Children's).

1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize Certificates will be awarded for each **class**.

The judges will award 3 points for every 1st, 2 points for every 2nd, and 1 point for every 3rd prize certificate awarded. The points will be added up when judging is complete.

1st, 2nd and 3rd prize rosettes will be awarded to the Braehead Community Garden members with most points in each **section** (Vegetables, Fruit, Chillies, Flowers, Homemade, Photography).

There will be 4 trophies:

Overall Winner: The individual with most points in total will be awarded the Overall Winner's trophy.

Braehead Community Garden Winner: The Braehead Community Garden member with most points in total will be awarded the Community Garden Members' trophy.

Gardeners' Trophy: The individual with most points in the growing sections (combined total of Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers and Chillies) will be awarded the Gardeners' Trophy.

Children's Trophy: The entrant with most points in the Children's section, regardless of age, will be awarded the Children's Trophy. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize rosettes will also be awarded for each age group in the children's section.

Prizes will be awarded at 3pm.

Rules

- i.* All classes shall be open to all, unless otherwise stated.
- ii.* All exhibits of Vegetables, Fruit, Chillies and Flowers shall have been grown by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
- iii.* All items entered in the Homemade Section and Children's Section shall have been made by the exhibitor.
- iv.* All photographs entered in the Photography section shall have been taken by the exhibitor.
- v.* One entry only, per person, per class.
- vi.* Every exhibit will be subject to a 10p entry fee except entries into the Children's Section, which are free.
- vii.* The decision of the judges is final.
- viii.* Any exhibitor using any means to deceive judges will forfeit all prizes.
- ix.* While every care will be taken, the organisers can accept no responsibility for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- x.* All entry forms and fees must be submitted to the Treasurer by 10am on the morning of the show.
- xi.* All exhibits must be entered by 10am.
- xii.* No exhibits may be removed before 4pm.
- xiii.* No unauthorised person will be allowed into the show while judging is in progress.
- xiv.* All existing rules relating to the use of the Braehead Community Garden shall apply.

TOP TIP!

When a class asks for more than one of an item, make sure they are well matched! They don't have to be huge. Whether it's 2 courgettes, 6 strawberries, or 5 dahlias, the right number of perfectly matched and unblemished ones will impress the judges!
