All are welcome to come and enjoy the day, why not enter your favourite veg, fruit or flowers. Here's some tips to help you .

When a class asks for more than one of an item, make sure they are well matched and in good condition. They don't have to be the biggest.

Whether it's 2 courgettes, 3 dahlias, or 4 squares of tablet, it's perfectly matched and unblemished ones that will impress the judges!

Vegetables

All Vegetables and Fruit should be presented on a plain paper plate, unless otherwise stated. Where it says 'named variety', please label it.

- 1. 2 courgettes
- 2. Heaviest courgette, marrow or other squash
- 3. 6 pods of peas, mange-touts, or sugar snap peas
- 4. 8 pods of French beans
- 5. 8 pods of runner beans
- 6. 2 leeks
- 7. 4 onions
- 8. Heaviest onion
- 9. 4 shallots (any variety)
- 10. 3 carrots (long variety)
- 11. 3 carrots (stump variety)
- 12. 1 swede
- 13. 3 globe beetroot
- 14. Collection of root vegetables, 2 each of 3 or more varieties (e.g. potatoes, parsnips, turnips, carrots)
- 15. Basket of veg suitable for soup (basket up to 30 cm across)

Note – all food / drink items will be tasted by the judges. All items of baking must be presented under cling film or in clear plastic bags, on a plain plate.

- 58. 1 jar of chutney, any variety
- 59. 1 bottle of home-brewed beer or wine

Children's Section

Braehead Community Garden Raised Beds

Note that the following classes are only open to Braehead Community Garden members who rent a raised bed in the garden.

This class will be judged at any time in the 7 days prior to the Show.

- 94. Best-kept polytunnel raised bed
- 95. Best-kept outdoor raised bed

Judging and Prizes

There are **95 classes**, spread across **8 sections** (Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers, Culinary, Crafts, Children's, Raised Beds).

1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize Certificates will be awarded for each class.

The judges will award 3 points for every 1st, 2 points for every 2nd, and 1 point for every 3rd prize certificate awarded. The points will be added up when judging is complete.

1st, 2nd and 3rd prize rosettes will be awarded to the Braehead Community Garden members with most points in each **section**.

There will be 4 trophies:

Overall Winner: The individual with most points in total will be awarded the Overall Winner's trophy.

Braehead Community Garden Winner: The Braehead Community Garden member with the most points in total will be awarded the Community Garden Members' trophy.

Gardeners' Trophy: The individual with most points in the growing sections (combined total of Vegetables, Fruit, Flowers and Chillies – but

excluding the Raised Bed section) will be awarded the Gardeners' Trophy.

Children's Trophy: The entrant with most points in the Children's section, regardless of age, will be awarded the Children's Trophy. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize rosettes will also be awarded for each age group in the children's section.

Prizes will be awarded at 3pm.

Rules

- i. All classes are open to everyone, unless otherwise stated.
- ii. All exhibits of Vegetables, Fruit, Chillies and Flowers shall have been grown by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
- iii. All items entered in the Food, Crafts, and Children's Sections shall have been made by the exhibitor.
- iv. One entry only, per person, per class.
- Levery exhibit will be subject to a 20p entry fee except entries into the Children's Section, which is free.
- vi. The decision of the judges is final.
- Any exhibitor using any means to deceive judges will forfeit all prizes.
- viii. While every care will be taken, the organisers can accept no responsibility for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- All entry forms and fees must be submitted to the organisers by 9.45am on the morning of the show.
- * All exhibits must be entered by 9.45am.
- xi. No exhibits may be removed before 4pm.
- xii. No unauthorised person will be allowed into the show while judging is in progress.
- xiii. All existing rules relating to the use of Braehead Community Garden shall apply.
